

# Max's Puppy Training Adventure!



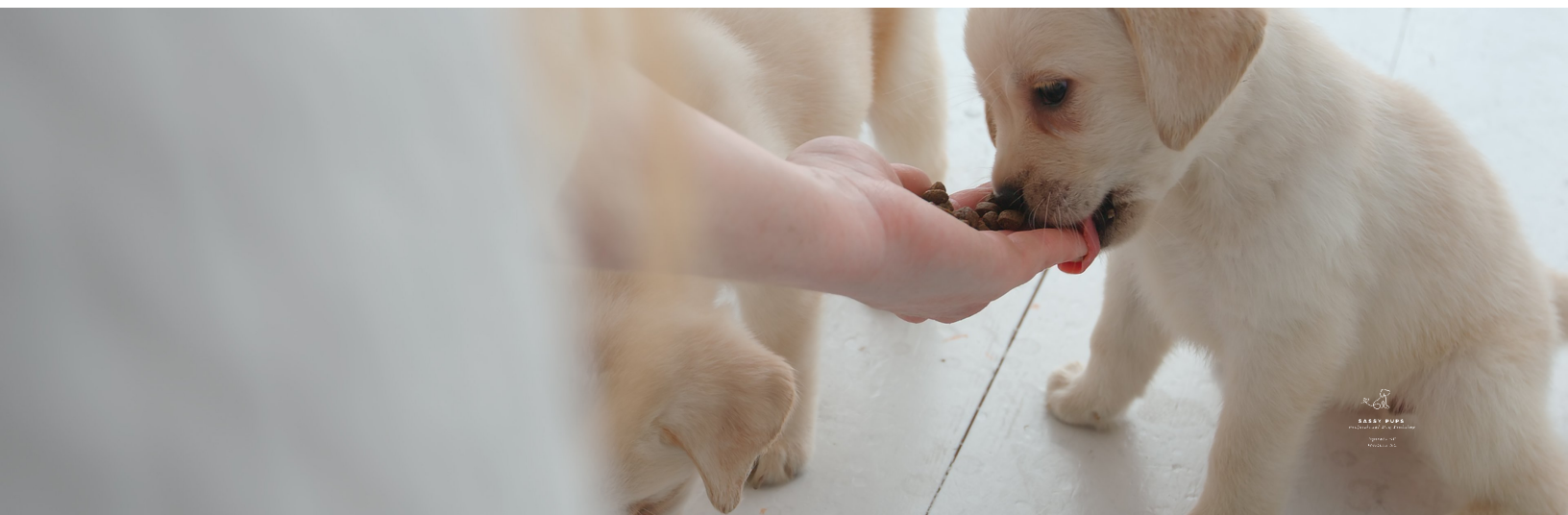


# Meet My Puppy, Max

**This is my puppy. His name is Max  
Max is fluffy, bouncy, and very curious.  
He is learning about the world and I'm  
learning how to help him!**

**We're a team. That means I help Max feel  
safe, and he  
helps me learn to be calm, kind, and patient.**

**Max learns best when I stay calm and kind.  
If he does something I like, I say "Yes!" and give him a treat.  
That helps Max know, "Good job! Do that again!"**





When he's learning, I never shout or grab.  
Max doesn't like loud voices or fast hands.  
He learns better when I use soft words and gentle hands.

Max is  
learning to sit, stay, come, and lie down.

We practice a little every day.

I use short words and happy praise.

Sometimes I give him a treat or a favorite toy.





If Max doesn't get it right, I just try again.  
I don't get mad. He's still learning, just like me.

We play fun games like:

**“Find It!”** I toss a treat and say **“Find it!”** Max sniffs to find it.



**“Touch!” Max taps his nose to my hand.**





**“Follow Me!” I walk around and he walks with me. If he follows, I say “Good boy, Max!”**

**Games help Max learn while we play.**



Max is learning to go potty outside. We take him out after he eats, wakes up, or plays. If he goes potty outside, we cheer! "Good potty, Max"



If he has an accident inside, it's okay.  
We clean it up quietly. Max is still learning.  
He needs time, and that's okay.

We walk Max on a leash.  
We use a special collar  
that fits just right.  
When he walks next to  
me, I say "Good walk!"  
and give him a treat.

If he pulls too  
hard, I stop  
walking. I wait  
and don't pick  
him up.

We practice being calm  
and walking together as  
a team.

**Max can't talk like us, but he shows  
how he feels.**

**If he licks his lips, yawns a lot, puts  
his ears back, or hides, he may be  
nervous.**

**That's when I give him space, speak  
softly, or stop what  
I'm doing.**

**Being a good puppy helper means  
watching for feelings  
with our eyes, not just our ears.**

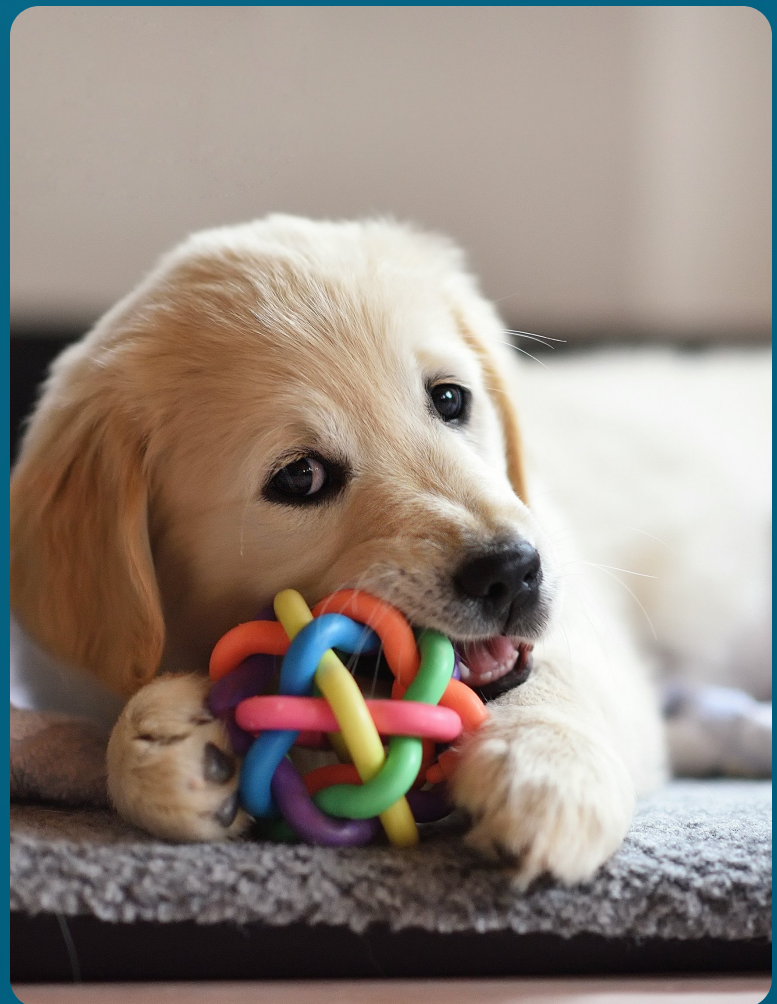
I always use calm hands with Max.  
I don't pull his tail or grab his paws.  
When we need to move him, we say  
his name and use gentle hands.



If Max doesn't want to be held, we don't make him.

Max gets to say "no thank you" with his body and I listen.

If he walks away while I am petting him, it's ok. I give him space. Sometimes I need space too!





Sometimes Max needs help staying clean. We brush his fur, wipe his paws, and check his ears.

We start slow, using soft brushes and quiet voices.

Max feels safe when grooming is gentle and calm.
